RECOMMENDS

Northfield City Council Asks Minnesota Department of Transportation to

IMPLEMENT INTERIM SAFETY SOLUTIONS FOR TRUNK HIGHWY 19

- WHEREAS, TH 19 is a primarily east-west corridor extending across southern Minnesota from the South Dakota border in Lincoln County to US 61 in Red Wing, linking multiple north-south trunk highway routes, including Interstate 35,
- WHEREAS, on October 16, 2018, the City Council approved a motion to approve a "focus area for the Northfield Transportation Advisory Committee to include Highway 19 corridor related initiatives,"
- WHEREAS, Northfield City Council Resolution 2018-085 established that "the Northfield Transportation Advisory Committee shall provide regular updates,"
- WHEREAS, in 2021 MNDOT began a corridor study area covers approximately 21 miles of TH 19 between TH 13 and TH 3 and as part of the study, MNDOT evaluated existing and future conditions,
- WHEREAS, the corridor study, including public input from both individual and institutional stakeholders, identified a variety of current safety concerns in the corridor, including specific locations of concern,
- WHEREAS, MNDOT has developed recommendations for long-term improvements along the corridor, including:
 - 1. A Mill and Overlay from I-35 to east of Armstrong Road and from the UP Railroad to TH 3.
 - 2. Reconstruction/Regrade from east of Armstrong Road to UP Railroad, a modified 3-lane design with a center left turn lane
 - 3. Improved trail, sidewalks, and ADA improvements.
 - 4. Improved pedestrian crossings near Post Consumer Brands
 - 5. Added and lengthening of turn lanes along the corridor
 - 6. Together with other items outlined in MnDOT Implementation Memo dated February 20, 2024.
- WHEREAS, MNDOT has programmed these long-term improvements to begin construction in 2027,
- WHEREAS, under this programming, the specific locations of safety concern would remain unaddressed until the programmed improvements on TH 19 are completed in 2027, a period of at least three years,

WHEREAS, public input and Northfield Transportation Advisory Committee discussions have identified four areas of special safety concern:

- 1. Post Holdings pedestrian crossing
- 2. Armstrong Road intersection with TH 19
- 3. St. Olaf entrance from TH 19
- 4. Apple Orchard entrance from TH 19

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that

the Northfield Transportation Advisory Committee

- 1. Shares with the City Council these four identified areas of special safety concern,
- 2. Recommends that Northfield City Council
 - a) request that MnDOT explore interim safety improvements for the identified locations and share recommendations with the City and the NTAC,
 - b) Urge MnDOT to implement interim safety improvement measures with all deliberate speed prior to the 2027 programmed project.
