| SAVE Suicide Awareness Voices of Education (Tour de Save) | Sechler Park   | 7/25/2020         | 7/7/2020                        | None requested                                       | 17th annual Tour de Save Northfield is a fund raising bike tour for SAVE put on by local cyclists and Cannon Valley Velo Club. There are 4 routes from 6 - 62 miles. Bikers ride on trails and some streets using rules of the road. A food truck will be available when riders return. Expected attendance will be 250 or less.   |
| Crazy Daze - Chamber of Commerce                          | Bridge Square & Division Str.  | 8/20/2020         | 8/4/2020                        | \$750  | Crazy Daze has been an annual event in Northfield for over 40 years. Bargain shopping provided by local retailers, and food specials at local restaurants. The event attracts local residents and out-of-town visitors from neighboring communities. Expected attendance is 500-1,000.   |
| Defeat of Jesse James Days                                | Numerous   | 9/12/2020         | 8/4/2020                        | \$6,150  | The Defeat of Jesse James Days 1-day event is being proposed to include food trucks and food booths in Ames Park and the Water Street Parking lot from 10 am to 10 pm, a community parade from noon to 1:30 pm, and a car cruise from 4 to 5:30 pm to bring together the Northfield community to celebrate an historic event. The parade would be a community parade of local people with no floats, walkers. Expected attendance is unknown at this time.   |
| Drive In Live   | St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Winona Str. from Sumner Str. E. to Ames.  | 9/20/2020         | 9/15/2020                       | \$650  | Drive-In-Live NFDL is a Feel-Good Free & Safe Drive-In Music concert in the St. Peter's Lutheran Church parking lot and surrounding streets featuring the Over & Back Band, Terry VanDeWalker & the RCAs, and a high school group, Beverage Men. Event will take place from 4-7 pm. Expected attendance is 100 cars (less than 250 people). Food will be available to be delivered to cars.  |

Set up will begin Friday Oct 9th and take down will be done by Saturday Oct 10th 4pm. The event will take place from 10am - 2pm on 10/10/2020. Estimated attendance is 300.
