

Group A Crime – 2025 Q2



Outdoor Warning Sirens in Northfield

Ever wonder when and why the weather sirens go off in Northfield? Here's what you need to know:

- Tornado Warning Sirens are activated when the National Weather Service issues a Tornado Warning for our area or when a tornado has been spotted nearby.
- Straight-line winds over 70 mph Sirens may also be sounded when severe thunderstorms with wind speeds exceeding 70 mph are expected. These winds can cause as much damage as a tornado.
- This applies to both the Dakota and Rice County portions of Northfield—because we're talking about weather, and it doesn't care about county lines!
- Sirens typically sound for about 4 minutes. There is no "all-clear" siren, so stay tuned to local news, weather apps, or a NOAA weather radio for updates.
- Remember: Sirens are designed to alert those who are outdoors. If you're inside, make sure you're signed up for weather alerts on your phone or have another way to stay informed.
- S Please don't call 911 just to ask why sirens are sounding—keep those lines open for true emergencies.
- Monthly Testing: Sirens are tested the first Wednesday of every month at 1:00 PM, weather permitting.

Community Alert: Be Aware of "Jugging"

Just when you thought you've heard it all, including the naming of crime tactics, we bring you "jugging"

This occurs when criminals watch individuals leaving banks, credit unions, or ATMs and then follow them with the intent to steal cash or valuables—often by breaking into a vehicle once the victim steps away.

How It Works:

Suspects may wait in bank parking lots watching for customers carrying bank envelopes or cash bags.

Victims are followed to another location (like a store, gym, or home).

Once unattended, the suspect breaks into the vehicle and steals the money or valuables.

Protect Yourself:

Be aware of your surroundings at ATMs and banks.

Avoid leaving money or bank bags in your car-even for a short time.

If you suspect someone is following you, call 911 immediately. Report any suspicious behavior in parking lots.

Our officers are actively monitoring for this activity and working to keep our community safe. As always, if you see something, say something.


