




1a – THE DISCOVERY ZONE what we mean by 'nature-based' play





POTENTIAL COST SAVINGS OPTION

Vendor provides the basic 'box facility' delivered to site; City of Northfield contracts for additional building enhancements [roof, siding, etc.]; total cost for this building was \$100,000

Cost for this structure is \$132,000 for complete design & supply delivery to the site; installation can be 1-1.5 times the cost of the building package; estimated cost - \$300,000



Habitat Enhancement Landscape Program [through BWSR]

HELP supports efforts to restore and enhance strategically located diverse native habitats found in Minnesota's natural areas, conservation lands, and open spaces to benefit declining populations of bees, butterflies, dragonflies, birds, and other wildlife species that are essential for ecosystems and food production. HELP prioritizes large-scale initiatives on the landscape that support these declining populations, with an emphasis on protecting pollinators. With HELP, BWSR intends to build new partnerships and fill gaps left by other conservation programs.

- \$3.5 million available in grant funding
- Eligible applicants: tribal governments, soil and water conservation districts, watershed districts, watershed management organizations, local government joint powers boards, counties, municipalities, non-government organizations, park districts and contractors
- Applicants can apply for a minimum of \$50,000 and a maximum of \$500,000
- Applications will be accepted through June 27, 2024

Minnesota Constitution Art. XI, Sec. 14. "The assets of the fund shall be appropriated by law for the public purpose of protection conservation, preservation, and enhancement of the state's air, water, land, flah, wildlife, and other natural resources."

Summary

The Legislative-Citizen Commission on Minnesota Resources (LCCMR) welcomes proposals for projects of all sizes that address the priorities and requirements described within this Request for Proposal (RFP) and that aim to protect, conserve, preserve, and enhance Minnesota's air, water, land, fish, wildlife, and other natural resources. The LCCMR reviews applications and makes funding recommendations to the Minnesota Legislature from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund (ENRTF). Approximately \$103 million is available from the Trust Fund through this RFP for projects beginning July 1, 2026. Most projects funded are two to three years in duration. Proposals must be submitted online at <u>journprojectment leg nor</u> by March 19, 2025.
