NEW Hometown Hoedown / Youth Horseshoe Hunt

Saddle up for a hoedown at Dakota Stables on Tuesday, August 27. This event is free and open to all ages and kinds of country bumpkins at heart. The evening will begin at 5:00 pm with age categorized, family friendly competitions, featuring activities like the potato sac race, the shoe kick, a team round bale roll, a sawdust hunt and more (bring your own blanket and lawn chairs). Hit the open range at any time during the evening and rope on over to the lasso station, roll up onto a wagon ride, curry on over to the grooming area, twine over to the ultimate hay bale toss, or cowboy up onto a horse and have yourself a ride. A catered

dinner from Betty Kayes will be provided from 6 - 7:15 pm, with the main event, the horseshoe hunt kicking off at 6:45 pm (register for the horseshoe hunt separately, \$5/individual or \$10/family max: Class # 1225-F19A). After the winning hunters have been branded, the pulling up of the britches may begin as an all-American western dance will close out the night from 7:15 - 8:00 pm. Be sure to harness up the family and trot on over to your hometown hoedown! All horseshoe hunters will be given a sheriff badge from the Northfield Historical Society. Hunt winners will earn chamber bucks and a Northfieldopoly game from the Northfield Chamber of Commerce. Hoedown attendees receive a free t-shirt and dinner, courtesy of Dakota Stables.
