All routes take place on public roads. Almanzo is a free event to participants. All participants are expected to follow rules of the road. The start line will be at 4th/Washington. 4th Street will be closed from the 4th Street bridge to Washington Street for the start of the event. Riders will be leaving town on 4th Street starting at 7 am. There will be no parking along 4th Street from the 4th Street bridge to Prairie Street until 9:30 am. All riders will be out of town by 9:30 am. Riders will be returning to town at various times and will be using rules of the road. The proposed finish line is at Central Park. Expected attendance up to 2,000 riders.

This event was started in 2009 and has seen new families participate each year along with new families eager to participate once their children reach age 6. The Y Kids Tri is a swim, bike, run event. The participants swim at the outdoor pool, followed by a bike ride on surrounding neighborhood streets and then complete the run in the field and paths adjacent to the pool. The event begins at 8:30 am and will be completed by 10:30am. Expected attendance is 150 participants and 300+ spectators.
