TEENS NEED LIBRARIES

- Teens ages middle-high school receive the least financial support from government, philanthropic & non-profits (Alliance for Excellent Education, 2015)
- Approximately 14 million middle & high school students are on their own after school (YALSA, n.d.)
- 51% of youth today live in low income families (YALSA, 2017)
- 55% of all public high school grads report feeling unprepared for college (YALSA, 2017)
- 66% of U.S. eight-graders read below the proficient level (YALSA, 2017)









KEY SERVICES THE LIBRARY PROVIDES TEENS




- Workforce development

TEEN READ MONTH

- October 1-31, 2018
- Literacy initiative created by the Young Adult Library Service Association (YALSA)
- Celebrate & encourage teens to read for fun and to visit their local library



- Teen Read Month at NPL:
 - Teen Fine Waiver October 1-31
 - TAB Booklist & display
 - Collection of book recommendations in YA section
 - Reader's advisory for teens by teens
 - Grand prize at the end of month



TEEN FINE WAIVER

ONE-TIME FINE WAIVER TO TEENS DURING TEEN READ MONTH, OCTOBER 2018

- Purpose > bring teens into the building that may have not been here for year
 - → (re)introduced to teen library programs & groups
- Fines at NPL
 - Patrons' accounts blocked after accruing \$10.00 in fines
 - A blocked patron may no longer check out items
 - What does this mean for teen patrons?
- Financial impacts of fine waiver
 - Number of teen cardholders at NPL: 6% (roughly 1,000 teens)
 - Outstanding, unpaid overdue teen fines, not including lost items: \$3,774
 - The impact is loss of users more than loss of fines
