The Arts and Culture Commission invites the community to nominate someone whom they feel is worthy of being considered its 2025 Northfield Living Treasure.

This annual award honors an individual who has, over a period of time, made significant contributions to Northfield in, through, or on behalf of the arts and culture, so as to enhance the reputation of the city and the quality of life of its residents and visitors. Culture encompasses the whole of the community's intellectual and social formation, including its work, thoughts, behaviors, and beliefs as manifested through the arts, food, oral languages, dress, homes, recreation, history, landscape, rituals, traditions, celebrations and festivals.

Nominees may be either a practitioner in one or more of the arts, or an arts or cultural leader, supporter, or advocate. The award is one of recognition and has no financial value. The recipient will be honored at the State of the City Address held at the Weitz Center on Tuesday, March 18th, 2025.
