Consider Approval of Final Concept for Phase II of the Northfield Skate Park Project and Authorize Preparation of Plans and Specifications.

Public Works Director/City Engineer David Bennett introduced the item giving background on the project. Bennett presented design features of the park. Designer Mark Leski, Wizard Skateparks, LLC, pointed out aspects of the park giving definitions of the park including beginner, intermediate and advanced parts of the park. Tyler Westman, Northside Boards, LLC, and Leski provided information on trends of skateboarding in Northfield and the population that uses the park. Police Chief Jeff Schroepfer added comments regarding rules of the park and City Code. Bennett answered additional questions from the Council.
