
Greetings to all! A special tip of the hat to those able to attend OCTOBER CHILLS--both shows went very well. The girls were proud of their work, as they were right to be.

Bridging Communities: A Celebration of Somali Culture


1:00-4:00 PM at the Northfield Public Library on Saturday, November 8.

Hosted by the Northfield Public Library in collaboration with Somali community partners and St. Olaf and Carleton College students, faculty, and staff.








Author Event

Katie Ruggle has received multiple Best Books of the Month and a Best Book of the Year. Katie now lives in Minnesota with her family.






As founding director of the Center for Infectious Disease Research and Policy (CIDRAP) and head of the newly-founded Vaccine Integrity Project, Dr. Osterholm has been on the global front lines of some of the worst public health crises of our time, advising multiple administrations on critical responses to disease outbreaks such as Ebola, HIV, SARS, Covid-19, and more. But his principal concern remains: we have failed to fully acknowledge the threat that viral outbreaks pose to the global population – and are woefully underprepared to manage through what may lie ahead.

An internationally renowned epidemiologist and bestselling author, **Dr. Michael Osterholm** is Regents Professor, McKnight Presidential Endowed Chair in Public Health, the founding director of the Center for Infectious Disease Research and Policy (CIDRAP) at the University of Minnesota.



Debby Walser-Kuntz is the Herman and Gertrude Mosier Stark Professor of Biology and the Natural Sciences in the biology department at Carleton College.


Teen Tuesday: Book club and TAB meeting

LEAGUE OF MINNESOTA POETS

The League of Minnesota Poets (LOMP) was established in 1934 "to make Minnesota poetry conscious, and conscious to its own poets" through four objectives: 1.) to encourage the study of Minnesota poetry in the state's schools; 2.) to create newspaper and magazine outlets for the best work of Minnesota poets; 3.) to publish periodic collections of verse by members, to publish a League magazine called The Moccasin, and to assist in providing a permanent record of accomplishments; and 4.) to accumulate historical material for a scrapbook, thereby preserving pertinent information about the organization.

LOMP achieves these goals through sponsorship of various poetry contests and sponsorship and participation in readings, collaborations, retreats, and other events throughout the state. Through publication of The Moccasin and other works, both digital and print, LOMP is committed to the highlighting our members' work. LOMP diligently documents our events, creating a lasting body of historical data. We hold biannual state meetings for our members in the spring and fall and annually send delegates to the National Federation of State Poetry Societies' June convention.
