PRESENTATIONS

2. <u>22-527</u> Presentation on Clean Energy Transition Plan from Nokomis Energy.

Brendan Dillon from Nokomis Energy provided a status update on the Clean Energy Transition Plan. The City has contracted with Nokomis Energy to develop possible scenarios for in-boundary carbon-free solar energy to meet the goals set out in the City's Climate Action Plan.

Dillon laid out the three primary goals of the Clean Energy Transition Plan: (1) 100% carbon-free electricity by 2030, (2) 10% in-boundary generation by 2030, and (3)

interconnection capacity to support residential systems.

Dillon laid out the four phases of the plan: (2023-2022; Phase 1) DERMS Pilot plus Energy Park, (2024-2027; Phase 2) Energy Park plus Commercial & Residential Solar, (2026-2028; Phase 3) Demand response plus more generation, and (2027-2030; Phase 4) Solve for the final elements. He went into the details of the four phases.

Assistant to the City Administrator and EQC Staff Liaison Risi Karim laid out the time line for the Clean Energy Transition Plan. The presentation will be given to the City Council for their review in September. In October, the EQC will be asked to approve the final plan. After EQC approval, the Clean Energy Transition Plan will come before Council for their approval.

Dillon and Karim answered questions from Commission Members.

Members of the public were given the opportunity to speak and ask questions of the presenter. Beth Kallestad and Martha Larson offered public comment.

3. <u>22-528</u> Northfield News Monthly Series Opinion Piece.

Chair Turner introduced the item. Commissioner Anderson offered his approval of the Northfield News Monthly Opinion Piece.

Cities and Communities Group Annual Meeting will be October 5th at the Minneapolis Central Library. Xcel is partnering with auto dealerships regarding EV options on August 25.

5. <u>22-530</u> Staff Update.

Assistant to the City Administrator /Staff Liaison Risi Karim discussed the 2022 EV Recharge Event which will be held October 15. She will follow up with members once more information is available.

Karim also discussed the issues members are having with receiving the EQC packet through the City's Notify Me option. Staff will look into the issues.

She also discussed a work plan for 2023 and how it will be limited to fewer, more attainable items from the Climate Action Plan.
