## Northfield Poet Laureate Report

The agendas for the ACC and Library Board include a recommendation to approve the appointment of Becky Boling and D.E. Green as the next Northfield Poets Laureate, to hold the position jointly until a more formal search can be conducted for a new Poet Laureate in 2024.

## **April Events**

**Penchant Day**. The highlight of National Poetry Month in Northfield was a one-of-a-kind event: the celebration of Penchant Day, officially proclaimed by the Northfield City Council to honor Penchant, founded roughly 50 years ago as Northfield Women Poets. The day itself was celebrated on Thursday, April 20 with a gala reading at Content Bookstore featuring 10 current members of Penchant, including co-founders Riki Kölbl Nelson and Karen Herseth Wee. A large audience was in attendance.

**Poetry Open Mic Evening (POME**). 16 people attended the open mic reading on the second Wednesday in April. Participants included 2 St. Olaf students and 3 Carleton students. Attendance at the monthly event has tripled since the first open mic night in November 2022.
