Thank you for your recent correspondence and for Northfield's active engagement in the real estate acquisition process between Dundas and Northfield for the Mill Towns State Trail. The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (MNDNR), Division of Parks and Trails, is supportive of Northfield pursuing a property interest in some form across the areas of 1700 and 1900 Dundas Boulevard, southeast of Rice County 78, which would provide for a contiguous corridor in public ownership between the two communities.

The possibility of routing a recreational trail through these locations is desirable because it will keep users on the Cannon River side of the active railroad grade and afford significant enhancements in scenery, safety and natural resource quality over the existing locally built trail in the nearby highway ditch.

MNDNR's vision is to eventually connect Dundas and Northfield by state trail for the public's use and benefit. We are greatly appreciative of the effort the City has put forth on behalf of the Mill Towns and our desire is to continue to work with local interests in completing this initiative.

Furthermore, we value our partnership with Northfield and our past successes working together to achieve commonly shared goals. Our commitment to that partnership has been demonstrated in recent collaborations, including the pedestrian bridge adjacent to Hwy 3, the Cannon River Regional Park Rest Area facility and the planning advancement for the trail connection through town, to name just a few.
