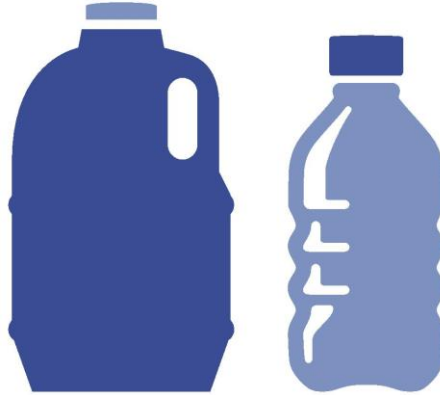
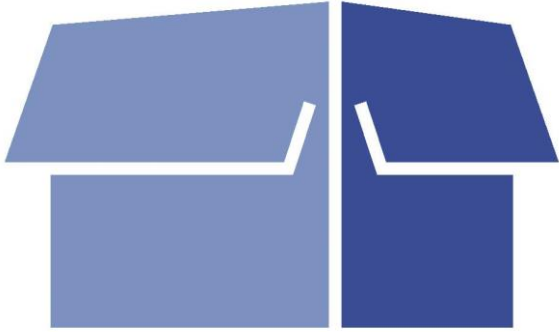


Waste in Northfield

Tricky recyclable items

- Aseptic packaging (broth boxes, juice boxes, etc)
- Milk and juice cartons
- Magazines and soft cover books
- Metal Household items like cooking pots
- Cleaner pizza boxes



Special Recycling

- Plastic bags and clean film plastic
 - Collected at Cub Foods and Econo
- Batteries
 - Most auto parts stores take car batteries
 - ACE Hardware and the Rice County Landfill accept rechargeable batteries
- Electronic waste
 - UCC Church runs collections periodically - larger items have fees
 - The Rice County Landfill accepts larger items for a fee
- Lightbulbs

Tricky landfill items

- Film plastic and plastic bags (if you can't get them to a recycling drop-off)
- Styrofoam
- Waxed paper and cardboard
- Microwave trays
- Porcelain and ceramics
- Glass bakeware, cookware, and drinking glasses

Household Hazardous Materials

- Lead Acid Batteries
- CFL light bulbs
- Refrigerators
- Paints
- Cleaners
- Pesticides

What can you compost?

In any pile

- Fruit and vegetable scraps
- Leaf organic matter, paper

With high-heat piles

- Meat, grease, and bones
- Dairy
- Greasy or dirty paper products (pizza boxes, paper towels, napkins)

With industrial composting

- All of the above
- Certified compostable materials (Look for the words BPI certified)
