- Identify geographical area with map, owners
  - A Roundtable map identified an area along 3<sup>rd</sup> St. from the Arts Guild to the Weitz Center. The team decided to limit our initial focus (phase I) to the #3 & 3<sup>rd</sup> St. Intersection area illustrated on Bill's drawings.

To do: Tracy, Andrea and Alice meet with new district MnDOT official involved in Context Sensitive Solutions. Alice contact state CSS director, Scott Bradley.

- Complete a Work plan (some components will be completed later)
  - o purpose

To collaborate with other community groups in continuing the improvements of the Highway 3 and Third Street intersection as Phase I of the Arts Corridor initiative, using Bill Johnson's "greening" elements (see below) to enhance human comfort and improve connectivity, safety, and community identity.

- desired outcomes
  - Improving the east-west connectivity of a core intersection that will reflect community identity and a unique sense of place.
- scope of work
  - Phase I will focus on the #3 & 3<sup>rd</sup> St. intersection with the intention of later expansion outward to the east and west along the Arts Corridor.
  - Corridor elements to be included will consider the wide spectrum of Bill's
    "greening" elements which promote safety and comfort, e.g., banners,
    sculpture, plants, lighting, trees, sidewalk poetry, seating, signage and water
    feature.
