Informed Council of Martin Luther King Day celebration at Emmaus Church at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, January 15. Answered questions posed by Council.

2. 18-016 Presentation of "Northfield for All: Liveable Communities Survey of Northfield Residents Age 50-Plus" related to the AARP Age Friendly Community Designation for Northfield.

> Carleton students Emily Kaegi, Grant Patronik, and Gege Zhang, along with Shelley Holden of the Northfield Age Friendly Advisory Committee and Patty Cernia of Three Links, gave a presentation on the data collected from the "Northfield for All: Liveable Communities Survey of Northland Residents Age 50-Plus". Carleton professor Dr. Katie St. Clair was present in the audience. Presenters answered questioned posed by Council.

Res. 2018-006 Res. 2018-006 Declaring a Local Emergency Public Works Director/City Engineer Bennett and Utilities Manager Wagner explained that on the evening of Monday, January 8, the lower level of the Wastewater Treatment Plant Biological Aerated Filter Building (BAF facility) was flooded with 5 ft. of water.
