- Add the following language at the beginning: 1) The Historic Preservation Commission reserves the right to address businesses that are not in compliance with the guidelines of the district or for failure to apply for a permit. 2) Existing non-complying signage will be brought into compliance upon receipt of any application to the Historic Preservation Commission.

- Move Item 4 between Items 1 and 2
- Item 3 correct typo to change "the" to "to"
- Add upper story window requirements

a State Historic Preservation review which determined they are not in line with the national standards. He will send a response and share with Chair Menard.

- Econo Foods will be replacing their monument sign with a 20' high pylon sign. A public art pad will also be installed in front of the sign.

- The Historic Preservation Conference will be held in Winona on September 14-15. HPC members are encouraged to attend.

*B.* Evans noted she and *C.* Clark will be giving bus tours in August, September and October. She would also like to discuss designating 2-3 homes and what it will take to get them on the register.

C. Clark stated Brett Reese has contacted him to review accent colors for Reunion.
