PUBLIC HEARINGS AND RELATED ACTION

6. <u>18-592</u> Public Hearing on the 2019 Budget and Tax Levy.

Mayor Pownell declared the public hearing open at 6:07 pm.

City Administrator Martig and Finance Director Angelstad provided information on the 2019 Budget and Tax Levy. City Administrator Martig, Public Works Director/City Engineer Bennett and Finance Director Angelstad answered questions posed by Council.

Pat Johnson, 44 Jefferson Lane, stated budget is overwhelming. Stated her taxes went up 13% this year and next year are proposed to go up 12%. Stated Senior Citizens cannot afford taxes. Stated development is way down and there is no growth in Northfield. Feels the City may need to subsidize developers in the future. Spoke regarding the size of the Inspection Department and asked how we can save money.

Doug Oines, 1900 Sibley View Lane, spoke regarding the increase in his taxes and home valuation. Stated that over an eight year period city taxes have increased a significant amount over the valuation and at a higher rate than the consumer price index during this same time.

- City Administrator's Update.

City Administrator Martig spoke regarding the budget and thanked staff for their work. He noted staff will move forward with additional positions. Noted the City received MnDOT Bridge Bond funds for Spring Creek Road Bridge project. Will have more discussion in the future. Noted Community Development Director Mitzi Baker started today. Interim Director Mike Ericson will be here through next Wednesday working on transition. Human Resources Department has been busy with staffing. Brian Whitt has been hired as the Liquor Operations Manager and will start on December 17. Rick Whitney has been hired as the new Wastewater Treatment Plant Supervisor. Noted Winter Walk on Thursday. Northfield has been named as one of the five best small towns in Minnesota. The winner will be announced at an event on Wednesday night.

REPORTS FROM THE MAYOR AND COUNCILMEMBERS

C. Ness - Reported on the Hospital Board meeting. Noted the Hospital is in a strong financial position and will be moving forward with the building project. This will be brought back to Council for approval.

C. Zweifel - Noted the Climate Action Plan Advisory Board meeting tomorrow night. The focus groups are continuing to meet. Anyone interested in assisting or wanting additional information should contact Wanda Playter. Noted there will be 2020 budget requests. Attended the Wellhead protection meeting and noted Well #2 needs to be replaced. This well spans both aquifers. The Water Use Plan will be coming to the Council in the future. Reported on the EQC meeting. The group talked about the loss of 150 trees in the storm. Noted there was no current source for tree replacement. There is interest in finding funding source.

C. Nakasian - No report.

C. Peterson White - Encouraged people to come to Winter Walk on Thursday.

C. Colby - Attend Charter Commission meeting. Noted there was discussion on what constitutes an unexcused absence and the duties of a commissioner.

C. DeLong - No report.

Mayor Pownell - Reported on the Hospital Board meeting and Council Employment Committee meeting. Noted the City Administrator Review process will be on the Council agenda on January 15. Spoke regarding Board/Commission interviews and noted over 50 people have applied. Many of the applicants are long term residents and have served elsewhere in the community, but are now wanting to serve on a City board. Appointments will be on the January 8 Council agenda.
