Winning poems have been posted to the ACC/Sidewalk Poetry page of the City website, posted to the Friend and Foundation of the Library website, displayed at the Library & City Hall, and shared with local media (along with the contest press release).

Sean Simonson and Bryanna Paarmann of the City Engineering Office have sent the poems to the mold manufacturer (Fourth Dimension) in vector format. Beginning in the spring and continuing through the summer, poems will be installed in City sidewalks, as weather permits. A Sidewalk Poetry Capstone Celebration will take place on Thursday, August 29, 2019, at 7 pm on Bridge Square in downtown Northfield. There are plans afoot for music in both English and Spanish.

Thanks are extended to Bill North of the Friends and Foundation of the Library for collecting the submissions and again working with me in preparing them for judging. I have been creating a list of Sidewalk Poetry Tasks to be used as a resource as I pass the coordination of the contest on to my successor.
