Members discussed the fact that the award currently allows for a “group” to be recognized as a Living Treasure. Members expressed a desire to recognize groups that make significant contributions to the arts in Northfield, but some questions were raised about how a group should be defined, and whether the Living Treasure award is the right mechanism for recognizing groups. The topic will be included on the agenda at a future meeting. **ACTION: Hold 1/20, 2/10, 2/17 and 2/24 as potential dates for the Award Celebration Ceremony.**

7. Presentation: Mar Valdecantos, Chair of Human Rights Commission, on land acknowledgement and recognizing indigenous peoples

Valdecantos informed the ACC about the process underway for acknowledging the history of the land and river in Northfield. HRC is suggesting a plaque be installed by the river telling the story of the river and its original name, “Inya Bosndata”. Would like to unveil it on Indigenous People’s Day in October 2020. Perhaps the installation could have an artistic element and be handled through the call to artists / PARC process. Conversation will continue on this topic.

Pursell: The Cannon River Watershed Partnership is interested in advancing this project. They began looking into the history of the river when they were involved with the “We Are Water” exhibit last year.

- c. Creative Placemaking (Lawrenz) -- working on adding a mural policy to the Public Art Policy, and addressing the question of defining a “cultural district.” Will meet again in January.

- a. Artists on Mainstreet Initiative (Lawrenz) — Attended a meeting in Wabasha, can open it up to ten smaller artists like last year, or can do a couple of bigger projects. Still thinking about which direction to go in. Will need to be decided in January. **ACTION: Get a report from Greg regarding the follow-up on the first year of the project.**
- b. Young Sculptors Project (Hauck) — Students are starting work tonight. Sara Hanson, the artist, is a sculptor with a lot of teaching experience. Eighteen students have signed up, ranging from 9th to 12th grade. An apprentice, William Lanzillo (a Carleton graduate), will be working with the group.
- c. Convention and Visitors’ Bureau: No addition to written report.
- d. Art in City Hall (Lawrenz) — Multiple pieces have been submitted for the “Beauty of the Count” exhibit. They will be reviewed next week and the show will go up in January and will be on display through September 18, 2020.
