

2020 Utility Rate Adoption and Update on Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) & Capital Equipment Plan (CEP)

Proposed 2021 Utility Rate Adjustments

- 2021 Utility Rate recommendation follows the Springsted Utility Rate study completed in 2018
 - Springsted Rate Study proposed consistent rate increases for 2019-2023
- 2021 rate increases will be the same as 2020 increases
 - Water 1% rate increase
 - Wastewater 1.75% rate increase
 - Storm Water 5% rate increase
 - Garbage no changes to rates
- An average residential customer would see their total utility bill increase from \$69.85 to \$70.97

Water Fund

- Water System Study \$100,000
 - RFP approval tentatively planned for consideration on October 6,
 2020

Wastewater Fund

• Implement findings from operational analysis and facility study

Stormwater Fund

- \$50,000 for interior river wall maintenance (tuckpointing, cleaning, sealing)
- 2021 staff will be reviewing the recommendations from the updated stormwater modeling, and neighborhood flooding issues
- \$2M expenditure in 2022 CIP for downtown flood improvements (riverwall expansion and enhancements), could be offset with advanced assistance federal funds
 - Study will occur late 2020 early 2021

Garbage Fund

- Compost site building replacement \$50,000
- Continued education and outreach on new services offered in the refuse/recycling hauling contract.
- Education related to waste reduction and use of Shoger Donation.
