- Northfield was an ACT on Alzheimer's community between 2014 & 2016
- Four individuals from ACT were tasked with finding a more sustainable plan for all aging issues
- The World Health Organization/AARP Age-Friendly initiative rose to the top


- Began with commitment from the City of Northfield



Housing Domain Action Plan

We Are

- A community that has
 - A variety of housing options.
 - Many that include supportive services.
 - Multiple initiatives addressing housing.

(Northfield HRA, Habitat for Humanity, Affordable Housing Task Force)

We Heard

- Survey respondents and listening session participants cited need for:
 - More affordable contractors and home repair services.
 - Housing options for all income levels.
 - Housing that features age-friendly design, supporting older homeowners to age in place.
 - Additional memory care options.
 - Exploration of alternative models. (Shared Housing, Accessory Dwelling Units)

We Envision:

A community that provides affordable and appropriate housing options and housing with supportive services that include older residents of all income levels and at varying stages of older age.

We Will:

- Partner with others to create more older adult housing and housing with service options.
- Create a listing of and ensure that older adults are aware of independent housing and housing with available services
- Partner with the City to develop guidelines that incorporate Universal Design in housing development plans.
