## Northfield Police Body Worn Camera Program

- BWC for all 24 officers
- Policy governing use and mandated recording of enforcement contacts
- Policy follows Minnesota data practices and privacy laws
- Costs of approximately \$1000/per officer per year.



### Police Body Worn Cameras

- Increase community confidence in the work of police officers
- Offer independent video of citizen encounters
- Instill trust in citizens having contacts with police
- Record evidence for later review
  - Prosecution, Complaints, Supervision



#### Recording of the Officers Work


- BWC's record the officers doing their work
- Helps to ensure officer are meeting department expectations and community standards
- Allows supervisors to review the officers work when the supervisor is not present
- Recordings protected by MN data practices laws






#### Meeting Societal Expectations

- BWC Use has become the norm for many departments and several states have mandated their use by all departments.
- Peer departments are using them including Farmington, Rosemount, Hastings, Red Wing, Faribault, and both the Dakota and Rice County Sheriff's Departments
- Suggested best practice by MN DPS, LMC, DOJ, NAACP,
   ACLU, IACP, President's 21<sup>st</sup> Century Policing Task Force
- 100% support from the Northfield Police Policy Task Force.



NOTE: Somewhat oppose, 7%; strongly oppose, 2%.
