OPEN PUBLIC COMMENTS

Helen Medin, 15374 Latopp Ct., Nerstrand, spoke on Sanctuary Cities. States she

thinks of two main issues- legal and emotional. States we are the strongest nation of the world because of our laws and our laws are made to be followed for our protection and that our laws have served us well. Would like us to wait on voting on becoming a Sanctuary City until after Jan 2017.

David Ludescher, Northfield, states he is an attorney, City Council member, and a Charter member. Spoke on his opposition to the Resolution passed on November 15th, 2016 Affirming the City of Northfield's commitment to be a safe, inclusive and welcoming community for all.

Victor Summa, 812 St. Olaf Ave., spoke to David Ludescher's remarks on the prior Resolution and his agreement with David Ludescher's statements. Thanked David Ludescher and Mayor Graham for their time and commitment to the Northfield City Council.

Jim Flaherty, 14825 Falk Ave., spoke on his belief that Northfield is a welcoming community for legal immigrants. Read United States constitutional statements regarding immigration. Spoke regarding possible consequences of becoming a Sanctuary City and loss of funding. Gave an example of potential education grants causing serious detriment to the community.

Peggy Prowe, 619 E 9th St., spoke on the importance of the Mill Towns State Trail and it's importance to the physical and economic health of the community.

Richard DeBeau, 46 Fareway Dr., expressed support for completion of the Mill Towns State Trail and his belief that it would have a positive impact on the community.

Gene Enders, 1427 Lake Dr., spoke on his support of the Mill Towns State Trail. Spoke on how many families he sees on the old trail despite it's deteriorated condition, that completing the loop would benefit the community.

Arique Aguilar, 1180 Cannon Valley Place, spoke on the Sanctuary City status. Has been part of Northfield community for 9 years. States there are preparations that need to be made. States we need to figure out what it would mean to be a Sanctuary City and how it would help our city flourish. Spoke on following through with the inclusion of all people in the City. Thanked the Council for discussing the topic.

Demetri Beeby, 608 St Olaf Ave., Spoke on the constitutionality of Sanctuary Cities and the Northfield Police Dept. involvement with immigration. Explained that Sanctuary Cities are not unconstitutional.

Scott Haugen with Dept of Natural Resources (DNR) spoke on the appraisal figures of the properties in question and answered questions posed by Council regarding the DNR's ability to fund trail maintenence. Noted that both offers to purchase the properties by the DNR were declined by the families.

Victor Summa, 812 St. Olaf Ave., spoke about a contiguous corridor between Northfield and Dundas and the lack of necessity for a new trail.

Patty Haskars, 306 Nevada St., spoke regarding improved safety with the proposed State trail. States the existing trail is not adequate.

Peggy Prowe, 619 E 9th St., spoke about the deteriorating existing trail and the prohibitive cost for Dundas to repair it.
