Engineering Manager Simonson introduced this item and answered questions posed by Council. Public Works Director/City Engineer Bennett provided information regarding State Aid funds and answered questions posed by Council.

Dan Christophersen, NAPA, spoke regarding parking related to the project and asked Council to look at data on parking studies. Noted concept has been approved, but has been told some things may change when the plans are created related to mountable curbs for truck access. Asked Council to make sure access to businesses is retained.

Chris Kennelly, 205 Water Str. and 7th/Division building owner, spoke regarding parking related to the project. Noted there is good parking right now, but the current concept takes away angled parking on the north side of 7th Street west of Division Street. Stated he would like the angled parking to go back in. Spoke regarding potential businesses coming into the area and noted concerns from tenants in building related to parking.

Todd Bornhauser, President Northfield Area Chamber of Commerce, noted business community is affected by loss of parking. Noted difficult process as property values and taxes are going up and now will have assessments that will have significant impacts on businesses. Stated he hopes Council is listening to businesses.

C. Ness - None

C. Peterson White - reported on NAFRS meeting. They are moving toward cost estimates for the facility. Attended HRA/EDA joint work session focused on affordable housing issues. Healthy collaboration and communication between the 2 groups. Attended the September 28 EDA meeting where they approved the contract renewal for NEC, worked on updating the business subsidy policy, heard a report from staff on business visits over the last 9 months. Noted seven businesses are considering some type of expansion. Businesses noted their main challenges are recruiting and retaining staff.

C. Zweifel - Confirmed 10/24 Finance Subcommittee meeting. Noted City board/commission training on October 25 and Democracy extravaganza on November 6. C. Nakasian - Attended Mill Towns Trail and Joint Call Center meetings. Noted National League of Cities meeting is in November. Attended meeting of midwest passenger rail. The FRA is completing study of the upper midwest and releasing preliminary studies. Minnesota and Iowa are not included. Encouraged people to sign up for the compost program.

C. DeLong - Attended NAFRS open house, County Road 1 open house and noted the video and roundabout drawings on how various size vehicles will navigate the roundabouts. Glad Meadows Park has been named. Asked if City was putting policies into a book. Glad to see staff will continue to explore turn back of 246.

C. Colby - Attended the Mill Towns Trail Joint Powers Board meeting. Even though some of the problems they are confronting are quite challenging, he is convinced the trail will get connected. Attended job fair on October 10 and noted many businesses looking for workers.

Mayor Pownell - Attended Human Rights Commission meeting. Superintendent Matt Hillmann spoke on the referendum and school work on Human Rights. City Administrator Martig gave an update on Municipal ID. The HRC is working on the MLK celebration. Attended the HRA/EDA joint meeting. Looking forward to seeing more of those types of meetings. Thanked Council Members for assisting with public engagements.
