Public Works Director/City Engineer Bennett introduced Engineering Manager Simonson and SEH representatives and answered questions posed by Council. Engineering Manager Simonson reviewed the project and answered questions posed by Council. Karl Weissenborn, SEH, reviewed the landscape elements for the project and answered questions posed by Council. Tom Sohrweide, SEH, presented information related to the all-way stop and intersection analysis related to the project and answered questions posed by Council.

At 7:04 pm, a point of order was called by C. Peterson White regarding germaneness of questions and relevance to change in decision-making of the body or a rhetorical question. Mayor Pro Tem Nakasian asked C. DeLong to reframe his questions related to design or refrain from question. C. Peterson White called for a point of order related to C. DeLong questions relitigating issues already decided. C. Zweifel asked for a ruling on the point of order and also finds C. DeLong out of order. Mayor Pro Tem Nakasian agreed and asked C. DeLong if he has a design feature question and to state that question in clear way. Mayor Pro Tem Nakasian noted the issue related to street width has already been raised and decided by Council.

Mr. Sohrweide noted there were no changes in engineering recommendations related to the design based on the vehicle counts. In addition, Mr. Sohrweide noted he doesn't believe the design would preclude trucks from turning.

Dan Christophersen - owner of NAPA & resident of Northfield. Commented on parking spaces with previously accepted plan versus new plan results in a loss of 3 spaces. Noted potential future project on the EconoFoods and extra driveway access. Doesn't feel there should be a loss of 2 parking spaces for a plan that isn't developed or approved yet. Thanked all involved for the work completed. Spoke regarding business access during the project.
