OPEN PUBLIC COMMENTS

David Ludescher, Northfield, spoke regarding loss of land of native americans. Spoke regarding the annexation agreement with Waterford. Asked Council to end narrative of land grabbing governments and urged council to honor the agreement that was made.

Mar Valdecantos, 6 Fareway Drive and HRC chair. Spoke regarding driver's licenses for all and immigration issues around the world. Noted driver's license for all will help at the State level. Noted many people want driver's licenses, but are not able to get them. Urged Council to approve the resolution of support and noted the HRC has already supported the resolution.

Sam Wilmes, Associate Editor Northfield News, introduced himself and invited people to feel free to reach out to him.

REGULAR AGENDA

14. [19-801](#) Discussion of the Pedestrian, Bike and Trail System Update Recommendations Submitted by Toole Design.

Streets/Parks Manager Behrendt introduced this item. Connor Cox, Toole Design, reviewed the changes made to the draft Pedestrian, Bike and Trail System report and the proposed Mill Towns Trail Route. Mr. Cox answered questions posed by Council. Council asked that the missing sidewalk/trail sections be added at 4th/Prairie/Wall Str. Rd intersection and Forest Avenue adjacent to Odd Fellows Park.

Don McGee, 710 Highland Ave., spoke regarding studies and plans and the need to do something regarding the Safe Routes to School gaps. Spoke regarding the need to study financing. Asked Council to find a way to come up with the money to fix these issues.

15. [19-802](#) Discuss Resolution Designating Mill Towns State Trail Location in Northfield

Connor Cox, Toole Design, City Administrator Martig, and Streets/Parks Manager Behrendt answered questions posed by Council. Scott Haugen, DNR Division of Parks & Trails, answered questions posed by Council. Haugen spoke regarding design standards for multimodal use, daily traffic volumes and safety of intersections. Haugen noted he couldn't answer questions related to cost because there hasn't been any preliminary design done for either option. Haugen spoke regarding DNR as a funding partner and the designated funding in the bonding package.

Peggy Prowe, 619 E 9th Str., spoke regarding connecting Mill Towns Trail to other trails in the area. Spoke regarding complications of various areas. Feels comfortable with spur going into town. Spoke in support of sidewalks and noted trail will help other parts of community.

Council discussed option a & b, importance of signage and a spur to downtown if option b is chosen, additional or alternate crossing options for Highway 3 such as at Jefferson Parkway, crossing options for Woodley Str., economic benefits of getting people downtown versus potential costs of the options and inquired about getting high level cost estimates for each option.

16. [Res. 2019-032](#) Consider Resolution of Support Driver's License for all Legislation in Minnesota.

City Administrator Martig introduced this item and answered questions posed by Council. City Clerk Little answered questions posed by Council.

Mar Valdecantos, HRC chair, spoke regarding the status of the driver's license for all bill and noted it has been through 4 or 5 committees. State this is not Real ID and there will be language on the driver's license noting it is not for voting.

Olivia Frey, 401 Highland Ave., encouraged council to support the resolutions. Noted MN Human Rights Commission, Sheriffs and other law enforcement, Minnesota Chamber are all supportive of this. Important to pass to for safety reasons. Stated she had collected 232 signatures in community in support of driver's licenses for all. Stated more people will get insurance and it is an overall livability issue.

Lucy Gonzalez Miron, Human Rights Commission member, spoke in support of driver's licenses for all. Noted it is an important issue for the community to be able to get to appointments and the grocery store. People drive out of necessity and having a driver's license would help everyone to feel safe. Thanked Council for support. Stated driving is not a privilege, but a right.
