Leatham stated this is a good step, approving the sale of 510 Washington St. S., as it shows the EDA is willing to take risk and invest in development. Baraniak noted he has faith in the developer, Rebound Stencil, based on their past projects and thinks it is great that the EDA is willing to help them with the project. Ackerman asked if the claw backs and extensions would come back to the EDA for approval and Carlson stated they would. Peterson White noted her support for the project.

Pownell entered the meeting at 7:41am.

President Ehrmann introduced the item and Carlson stated the developer approved the contract before the EDA. The developer has begun site preparation for the project.

Ackerman asked if the EDA would want to pursue a personal guarantee from not just Rebound, but Stencil as well. Carlson felt it wasn't necessary as there are other securities in place through the mortgage, subordination agreement and a personal guarantee from Rebound. Ackerman stated she does not support the resolution in it's current state and offered an amendment to the motion, which added a second personal guarantee from Stencil. The motion was seconded by Pownell, but failed on the vote.

A motion was made by Peterson White, seconded by Pownell, to approve EDA Resolution 2019-007 approving a \$250,000 EDA Revolving Loan to Rebound Stencil Development, LLC. The motion carried by the following vote:

Tisidra Jones, Strong & Starlike, presented her and Maggie McKenna's findings on the business environment for minority-owned businesses in Northfield. Jones noted three key findings, three main recommendations and four next steps to continue the process.

Discussion was held on:

- -the businesses contacted were excited to be heard and part of the process,
- -how connecting with all the minority businesses in Northfield will take up to 3 years to establish a working relationship and programming,
- -translation of documents,
- -how this is a continued learning opportunity for cultural competency and inclusive practices,
- -and how similar-sized cities like St. James and Worthington are doing community outreach, adjusting their boards and staff to better reflect their communities, and following through on their word and work.

President Ehrmann thanked Jones and McKenna for their work and asked to provide staff a route to connect with them in the future.
