**11.** <u>20-546</u> Rice County Comprehensive Plan 2040 presentation.

Community Development Director Baker introduced Julia Hogan, Rice County Planning Technician, Environmental Services. Hogan presented Rice County's draft vision and goals for economic development, land use, transportation, housing and livable communities design, parks, recreation and open space and sustainability. The 2040 draft is open for public comment. Baker, Hogan and Rice County Zoning Administrator Trent McCorkell answered questions from Council.

**12.** <u>20-547</u> Consideration of Call for Public Hearing for Ordinance Implementing Franchise Fees.

*City Administrator Martig introduced item. Described franchise fees as an alternative to MN Statute 429 and special assessments for funding for City's projects. Martig described Options A, B and C for Franchise Fee structure possibility. Martig, Director and CIPMA Doug Green of BakerTilly and Public Works Director/City Engineer Bennett answered questions from Council.* 

A motion was made by Council Member Zweifel, seconded by Council Member Peterson White, to approve Calling for a Public Hearing on November 10, 2020 at 6:00 pm to consider proposed ordinance for gas and electric franchise fee with the following two ordinance option combinations: Option C: Gas Franchise Fee 5.0% streets, trails and climate and Electric Franchise Fee 4.0% streets, trails and climate. The motion carried by the following vote:

*City Administrator Martig introduced item and provided information regarding state of emergency, meeting format (in-person or virtual) and enhancement opportunities (ex: ways to improve public comments) if meetings continue to be conducted virtually. Council discussed. Martig answered questions from Council. Consensus was to continue virtual meetings until indicators point to in-person meetings being safe.* 

# **14.** Res. 2020-104Consider Resolution Ordering Preparation of Plans and Specifications for<br/>Honey Locust Drive East Cannon River Trail (ECRT) Connection.

Engineering Manager Simonson introduced item. Alignment 1 is recommended by staff due to land acquisition, project cost and wetland mitigation. Funding methods discussed. Public Works Director/City Engineer Bennett and Simonson answered questions from Council.

**15.** <u>20-549</u> City Administrator's Update.

*City* Administrator Martig noted one week remaining on posting to replace Library Director. Martig anticipates that finalists would engage with Council, Boards & Commissions, and public. Martig acknowledged bonding bill with Governor Walz includes \$1.75M for local transportation, thanked State Representative Lippert and State Senators Draheim and Little for their work on it. Roundabout project ribbon cutting will occur on 10/23 and opening will occur immediately afterward. Snow emergency has been declared due to today's snowfall. Plowing to occur tomorrow; Martig encouraged everyone to sign up for alerts. Parklet installations have encountered delays, plan to finish soon.
