Update on Northfield Area Fire & Rescue Services (NAFRS) fire station expansion project.

Summary Report:

On Thursday, November 18 the NAFRS Board unanimously recommended approval of financing that includes an updated cost estimate, lease agreement, and joint powers amendment (approved at the October meeting) to the partners.

Attached is the updated cost estimate, draft lease and joint powers board amendment. Additionally, there have been some changes to the site plan from past Council approval including a change in the access drive off Highway 3 and the staff recommended removal of the communications tower.
