Review of Proposed City Council Ordinance on Human Rights Commission and Potential Pending Bylaw Revision.

Summary Report:

The Northfield City Council approved the first reading of the ordinance that will add up to four voting or non-voting advisory members to the Human Rights Commission. The terms would be for one year and the status of voting or not would be at the discretion of the Mayor. This is in addition to the ten board members there are currently.

The Human Rights Commission (HRC) had met at a special meeting on January 4. The HRC had approved recommending to the Council an ordinance with provisions that are consistent with the revised ordinance. Staff is working on the special meeting minutes to be either provided this evening (will hand them out at the meeting) or at the February board meeting.

Staff will be reviewing the bylaws of the HRC approval in preparation of consideration at a future meeting.
